2. To use strength-based approaches in mentoring
3. To explain how power can influence a mentoring relationship
4. To enter into a mentoring agreement with your mentoring partner
5. To list the stages in the mentoring relationship
6. To support the development of leadership skills
7. To encourage self-care for your mentee and yourself
8. To support the development of anti-racism strategies
9. To plan the next steps in your mentoring journey.
