Community engagement and objective school achievement forms a significant part of the assessment criteria of the Aspire program, not ATAR scores. For mature age students (21+) who did not finish school and/or do not have an ATAR. Based on an interview with a brief written component. If successful students will enter into a 6 month program of 3 units. Students will attend regular university classes and have access to additional weekly group and individual academic assistance. When complete the students will be able to enter a university undergraduate degree with 1-2 units credit.</p> <p><b><i>Diploma of Tertiary Studies</i></b>  The DoTS program is equivalent to first year of a university undergraduate degree. You can enter directly into second year of a range of Monash degrees upon successful completion of the Diploma. DoTS is a one-year study program that goes towards a Monash degree DoTS is offered at our Berwick and Peninsula campus. When</p>
